Just about one week ago, I heard a story that was an amazing example of courage, independence, caring and feistiness. As reported in USA Today, on July 18, 2024: Three Washington girls are being hailed as heroes after they stopped the attempted kidnapping of a 6-year-old girl. Police got a 911 call about a man abducting a young girl at an apartment complex in the Seattle suburb of Kent just after 8 p.m. Tuesday, according to the Kent Police Department.

What goes through your mind when you hear this? I was filled with awe. People often discount children's abilities to observe, be responsible, be off their phones. This story gave me hope for the future of youth in general.

I look at the courage of these young girls, these children, who stood up in a dangerous situation to fight for someone so small. Someone who was left alone without adult supervision, who didn't have the support around that she needed at that time.

Then, I think about Israel. A tiny country, around the size of Rhode Island. A country that is **SURROUNDED** by countries that wish for her destruction. They shout "From the river to the sea." Do you know what this means? This is a call for the destruction of Israel, the destruction of the Jewish people.
